As 2015 draws to a close, we look back on the accomplishments of the journal and would like to briefly share these, as well as highlight some of the most viewed and cited articles in 2015.

- ✓ Over 50 articles published in 2015
- ✓ Over 25,000 article accesses per month
- ✓ Submissions increased by 25% (compared to 2014)

2015 saw a marginal increase in the journal's Impact Factor (IF) to 0.89 – the journal's highest IF to date!
