

CHEO (Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario) is inviting applicants for a full time Pediatric Otolaryngology – Head & Neck Surgery position.

The Division of Pediatric Otolaryngology – Head & Neck Surgery at CHEO is affiliated with the University of Ottawa Otolaryngology training program and is comprised of 4 academic fellowship trained Pediatric Otolaryngologists and a part-time neurotologist.

CHEO is the only pediatric referral center for Eastern Ontario, Western Quebec, and Nunavut. CHEO provides comprehensive, family-centered, interdisciplinary diagnosis and treatment for congenital, and acquired surgical conditions, traumatic injuries, cancer, and other complex health conditions of childhood.

The successful candidate will join four surgeons at a comprehensive, freestanding, Children's Hospital with an established teaching and research focus. The preferred candidate will;

- Have certification in Otolaryngology- Head & Neck Surgery from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (or equivalent)
- Be eligible for licensure by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario
- Be eligible for appointment to the Department of Otolaryngology - Head & Neck Surgery, University of Ottawa
- Have a strong academic/research/innovation background and is expected to complement the Division's Academic and research productivity.
- Be expected to be fully engaged in the residency and fellowship training and participate in education of medical students.
- French language skills are an asset.

The source of physician income is based on a long standing fully mature Alternate Funding Plan.

As capital of Canada, Ottawa is a large multi-cultural city with many urban attractions and very close to Gatineau Park, which offers many easily accessible recreational opportunities. Housing is affordable and schools and health care are of high standard, making for an ideal family environment.
