PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This is my favorite time of year - the first crop of lettuce, kale and arugula shows up on the dinner table; the peas and tomatoes are firmly entrenched in the garden, and you can tell it is going to be a good harvest in the fall; the birdsong that you hear in the morning is invigorating and cycling now involves fewer layers of clothing and includes the elevation of the north shore mountains. It is a time to replenish, rejuvenate and refresh.



Consistent with the “grow local – consume local” theme, we continue to explore ways in which to make our meeting in Vancouver as carbon neutral as possible. We plan to offer local food and beverage (read: [Okanagan wines!](#)) options as much as possible and have challenged the Chefs at each of the venues to do so. There will be no disposable swag, with one exception: we plan to offer each attendee a reusable travel mug for use throughout this conference as well as future conferences. Arguably, this is not a sustainable choice, but an investment in you and future meetings at which it will not be offered any longer. Ms. Donna Humphrey (and family) has explored means of calculating the carbon footprint of our meeting and means to offset the carbon emissions deemed unavoidable. Clearly, the largest carbon footprint will be the airplane travel involved in personal attendance – a necessary evil. However, we are exploring means to offset this including offering at the time of registration, the opportunity to purchase a carbon offset. Many registrants have chosen to do so; others have chosen to do so in their own ways. Members of your CSO-HNS Executive are committed to doing this as well.

In addition, we have challenged our partners in industry to be part of the solution. The response has been incredible. Without exception, the companies have recognized the role the supply chain for health care plays in carbon emissions. They have been challenged to redefine our health conference relationship as they have been told they should not/cannot fly in product that they have traditionally brought at huge financial and environmental expense. Hence, they/we will need to redefine the health care conference model so that attendees and sponsors each attain that value-added, so important for improving quality of care provided.

We have a plethora of speakers committed to informing us about the problems associated with climate change but also the path to solutions. Each of us will learn what we can do differently to minimize the carbon footprint of surgical care without compromising the quality of services provided.

Vancouver will be different. Vancouver will be thought-provoking. Vancouver will be simply amazing. You will not want to miss this meeting.

I am looking forward to seeing everyone in person in October.

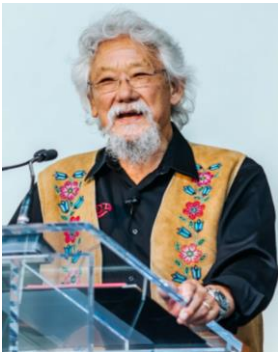

We are very pleased to welcome Dr. David Suzuki as the Keynote Speaker for the Society's 76th Annual Meeting.

Dr. David Suzuki is an award-winning scientist, environmentalist, and broadcaster. He has made it his life's work to help humanity understand, appreciate, respect and protect nature. He is familiar to television audiences as host of the CBC science and natural history television series *The Nature of Things*. David was the recipient of The Canadian Academy of Cinema and Television's 2020 Lifetime Achievement Award. David has been recognized by BC Achievement in partnership with the

Lieutenant Governor of BC for his extraordinary work as a recipient of the 2021 BC Reconciliation Award. Dr. Suzuki is a Companion to the Order of Canada and a recipient of UNESCO's Kalinga Prize for science, the 2009 Right Livelihood Award, and UNEP's Global 500. He is Professor Emeritus at the University of British Columbia in Vancouver and holds 31 honorary degrees from universities in Canada, United States and Australia. His written work includes more than 55 books, 19 of them for children.

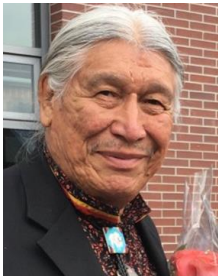

Dr Andrea MacNeill is a surgical oncologist at Vancouver General Hospital and BC Cancer, and a clinical associate professor at the University of British Columbia where she specializes in sarcoma and peritoneal malignancies. She is the founder and principal investigator of the UBC Planetary Healthcare Lab, a novel interdisciplinary research collaborative dedicated to creating health systems that promote both human and planetary health. As the Medical Director of Planetary Health for Vancouver Coastal Health, she is working on a transformational planetary health strategy for the health authority, to mitigate the healthcare climate footprint while creating health and social value. She is an executive member of CASCADES, a pan-Canadian knowledge mobilization network dedicated to accelerating the transition to low-carbon, sustainable health systems in Canada. She is currently co-chairing a UBC/Yale led Lancet Commission in sustainable healthcare.

ELDER FRANÇOIS PAULETTE, Yellowknife, BC



Elder François Paulette

A Denesuline and member of the Smith's Landing Treaty 8 First Nation, François Paulette survived the residential school system before going on to become the youngest Chief in the NWT Indian Brotherhood in 1971. He challenged the Crown to recognize treaty rights and aboriginal title to over 450,000 square miles of land in the historic Paulette case. He remains a passionate advocate of treaty and indigenous rights and is recognized in the courts as an expert witness on historic treaties.

François takes pride in maintaining his Dene language and the traditional knowledge that derives from his close relationship with the land. He was one of the founding members of the Dene Cultural Institute and continues to serve as an interpreter of traditional knowledge and a facilitator of cross-cultural understanding.

Dr Watts is the Chief Sustainability Officer of the NHS, responsible for its commitment to deliver a world-class net zero emission health service. Based in London, he leads the Greener NHS team across the country, which focuses on improving the health of patients and the public through a robust and accelerated response to climate change and the broader sustainability agenda. Nick is a medical doctor licensed in Australia and the UK, and a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians' Faculty of Public Health. Prior to the National Health Service, Nick worked internationally as the Executive Director of the Lancet Countdown and the Lancet Commission on Health and Climate Change, a collaboration of UN agencies and academic centres across the world. He has also focused on engaging the health profession on the links between public health and climate change, having founded both the Global Climate and Health Alliance and the UK Health Alliance on Climate Change.

Dr. Courtney Howard

Dr Courtney Howard is an Emergency Physician in Yellowknife, in Canada's subarctic, and a Clinical Associate Professor in the Cumming School of Medicine at the University of Calgary. She is a nationally- and globally recognized expert on the impacts of climate change on health, and in the broader field of planetary health.

For Dr. Howard, grounding her work in planetary health started a decade ago motivated by two experiences at the opposite ends of the earth: In Canada's North she heard her mostly Indigenous patients relate how the rapidly changing landscape was impacting their food security and physical safety on the land, and read that malnutrition is likely to be the most severe health impact of climate change this century.

The Westin Bayshore's Green Initiatives

This year's convention hotel takes their responsibility to the planet seriously. The Westin Bayshore has incorporated many green and more environmentally sustainable practices into their daily operations. Here are some of the highlights...

Kitchen and Stewarding

- Purchase locally available products whenever available



- Careful disposal of organic matter (composted off site)
- Recycling of all bottles, tins, containers, pallets
- Deep fat frying oil and fats are recycled offsite
- Recycle cardboard boxes from incoming shipments

Housekeeping

- Guest rooms have all been equipped with recycling blue boxes since 1993
- Optional linen cleaning program allows guests to choose whether or not they want to reduce their linen washing – saving energy and water
- Non-toxic cleaners used in housekeeping and laundry
- Left over soap and shampoo is collected and given to charity, used linen is recycled as rags and drop sheets for painting and old towels donated to the Vancouver SPCA
- Uniforms are now made from recycled plastic

Engineering

- Newly renovated rooms have reduced the hotel's energy consumption by 60% by installing state-of-the-art digital room thermostats
- Sophisticated control system for cooling plant that senses a number of different variables before deciding which chillers to start and stop = saves electricity
- Building control system give engineering individual control over the temperature of every meeting room – ensures that empty rooms have their heating and cooling reduced as required
- The hotel is a BC Hydro PowerSmart partner and works closely with the Green Key account representative to ensure that they are taking advantage of best practices from all industries

Front Desk

- Mobile check-in allows guests to use their mobile devices to check-in and reduce recycling of keycards
- Guests can opt into the green check-out whereby their folio is emailed at check-out to reduce paper
- Parking is discounted for hybrid / electric vehicles

Banquets

- **NEW** A switch has been made to recyclable aluminum water cans only which makes all events 100% plastic free.
- **NEW** Partnership with the "Earth Group", an organization based out of Alberta that supports the World Food Programme (WFP) to help provide school meals to children. To date they have funded nearly 4 million school meals for children through the sale of their products.
- Garbage and recycling sorting stations throughout the convention centre; Recycling blue boxes in all meeting rooms
- To reduce waste, pads of papers, pens and water are set as stations in meeting room instead of at each place setting (clutter free stations)
- Water cooler stations available in meeting rooms as a standard
- Go linenless: custom buffet tables and back bar units that require no linens, reducing energy and water for linen cleaning
- Bio-degradable wooden cutlery and recyclable boxes for to-go meals and use of mugs instead of teacups and saucers to reduce dish washing

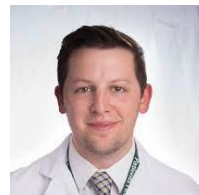
