Message from the President

Dear Colleagues and Friends,

"I feel this weight on my shoulders."

I can't count the number of times I have said and heard this statement over the past two years. I am sure you have as well.

The source of the weight is often tangible: the extra protocols in place in the operating room; the extra cleaning between patients in the clinic; the inherent inefficiencies introduced; the number of patients intubated in ICU's; the ever-climbing death toll during this pandemic.

However, often the source of the weight is intangible, at least to me. And that is what I think I have found most troubling. Whereas previously always effective in lifting my spirits, time on the bike does not seem to help as much.

We tell ourselves: "We are healthy when many are not." "We have a steady job when many do not." But "I'm languishing" is the new response to "How are you?", not clinically depressed but definitely lacking our usual enthusiasm.

Health care professionals are a resilient group as well. Witness the coming together of medical doctors, nurses, respiratory therapists, physiotherapists, community health workers, hospital aids - and members of the public - to meet an unprecedented challenge. And we met that challenge admirably.

What has helped us through these times? I can tell you a few from my side.

We have a highly cooperative and collegial membership connected through our Canadian Society. Certainly, having Dr. Ian Witterick as the President of our Society during the past two years (twenty-five and a half months he would correct me) has helped us all immensely. His leadership in pulling together guidelines for providing routine care and for the safe management of COVID positive patients was invaluable. His calm, thoughtful demeanor comforted us all. We could not have asked for a better Leader during these turbulent times. Although his leadership was acknowledged during our virtual Annual Meeting, I will say again on behalf of all members of our Society a huge thank you to you, Dr. Witterick. The debt owed to you by our members can never be repaid.

Message from the IFOS 2022 Scientific Program Chair

Just prior to the pandemic in late 2019, we were on our way to organizing IFOS Vancouver 2021. Careful selection of both the Canadian and IFOS/International Chairs and Co-Chairs had taken place. For the subspecialty areas, many committee members had been chosen along with topics and speakers. Of course, COVID-19 brought everything to a halt and out of respect for the safety and concern of the otolaryngology community across the world, it was inappropriate to proceed. We recognize that we are still not on our way back to normalcy and that many places throughout the world are still struggling to a very significant degree. However, we had to begin to plan once again. The logistics of organizing an international meeting when there are still unknowns are challenging. We hope to be able to have a hybrid meeting (combination of an in-person and virtual program) if allowed. Contingency plans are in order to deal with any issues that may arise due to the ongoing pandemic.

Subspecialty Otolaryngology Head and Neck Surgery Chairs and Co-Chairs as well as many of their committee members from Canada and internationally from around the world, are back working on topics and speakers to present at IFOS Vancouver 2022.

The areas that key leaders in their field will be presenting include Audiology, Education, Otology/Neurotology, Head and Neck Surgery, Sleep Medicine and Surgery, Pediatric Otolaryngology, Global Health, Laryngology/Phoniatry, Salivary Disease and Surgery, Vestibular Medicine, Facial Plastic Reconstructive Surgery, Physician Wellness/Health/ Diversity, General Otolaryngology and Rhinology/Skull Base/Allergy.

The Three Main Plenary Session topics are:

- A Planetary Panel on Climate Change; Moderator: Dr. Courtney Howard, Emergency Physician, Community Research Fellow, Planetary Health, Dahdaleh Institute for Global Health Research, York University
- Diversity and its Role in Health Care; Dr. Jocelyn Clark, Executive Editor, The Lancet
- Deep Learning and Artificial Intelligence in Otolaryngology; Confirmation of speakers pending.

Regardless of their area of focus, every type of otolaryngologist will undoubtedly enjoy these diverse areas that pertain to us all.

Many of the subspecialty areas in our field will also have the opportunity to showcase major topics of interest for attendees in Focused Plenary Sessions. Two examples that keep in mind the theme of IFOS Vancouver 2022 "Globalization of Healthcare" are:

- "Cochlear Implantation and Other Assistive Listening Devices: Reaching out to all parts of the world so they too can listen."
- "Rhinology and Skullbase Disease: The tried, the true and the new! Where best to be most effective, economical and safe."

We are very pleased to report that our Journal continues to thrive in 2021. Submissions have kept pace with 2020 which was a record-setting year for the publication. The current acceptance rate sits at 19% with a continued focus on strong science as the most important metric for acceptance. The 2-year Impact Factor has increased to 2.441 placing JOHNS 18th out of 44 OHNS journals, a tremendous achievement for the Journal, and placing us near the top of the second quartile for OtoHNS periodicals.

The backbone of JOHNS are the Associate Editors and Reviewers. We owe them a large debt of gratitude for their time, expertise and dedication to the journal. Another sincere thank-you must go to the Social Media Team who have been responsible for not only creating excellent visual abstracts but also getting the journal out on social media. The article submission process remains <u>unchanged</u>. You still require the CSOHNS membership code <u>on submission of your manuscript</u>. The Journal remains healthy due to the quality of submissions and the support of the members of the Canadian Society of Otolaryngology - Head and Neck Surgery. 2021/2022 Canadian Fellowship Awards

Dr. Dan O'Connell, Edmonton, AB Fellowship Committee Chair

Congratulations to Dr. Neil Arnstead and Dr. Peter Dixon the recipients of this year's Canadian Fellowship Awards. Below you will find an update from them on their experiences to date.

Dr. Neil Arnstead, University of Toronto, Toronto, ON

Head & Neck Surgery / Skull Based Surgery—University of Toronto

My fellowship has been extremely busy and rewarding so far. Over the first three months, I've performed twelve major head and neck cancer ablations, thirteen endoscopic or open resections of sinonasal tumours, and four combined neurosurgical and otolaryngology anterior skull base tumour resections and reconstructions, in addition to 30 sinus surgeries for inflammatory disease. The hiring of a new faculty at Mount Sinai Hospital has also allowed me to gain some exposure in elevation and microvascular free tissue transfer.

I'm extremely grateful to have the support of the CSOHNS Fellowship Award to supplement the salary for my fellowship as it has allowed me to maximize the variety in advanced skills I can acquire, rather than taking days to simply pay the bills. Thank you so very much!

Dr. Peter Dixon, University of Toronto, Toronto, ON

Otology/Neurotology—University of California San Diego

Through the first 4 months of a 2-year neurotology fellowship, it is rewarding to reflect on my experiences and to recognize that this pace of learning and development will continue.

In this short time, I have participated in more than 60 lateral skull base tumour cases and countless otology cases. In clinic, I am witnessing and engaging in complex decision-making for rare pathologies and refining my approaches to common conditions with pearls from neurotologists with varied training backgrounds and decades of experience.

Research has been similarly engaging. I have worked diligently to adapt patient intake processes for the highest-volume vestibular schwannomas center in the U.S. to facilitate high-quality prospective clinical data collection, an initiative that has already generated data that will answer a number of important clinical questions. I am establishing collaborations with epidemiologists at one of the country's largest health insurance plans to initiate population-based health services research related to hearing loss and vestibular dysfunction.

The recent fellow boot camp dissection course provided the opportunity to foster friendships with neurotology fellows across the country. The fun had that weekend has me excited about a career of collaborations, national meetings, and professional development. Being a member of a collegial network of like-minded individuals is, for me, one of the most rewarding draws to an academic career.

Personally, I am working to establish sustainable time management routines to prioritize and protect time with my wife, Sarah, and our 4-month-old son, Hugo. The CSO fellowship fund has been immeasurably helpful to our family in making this continued training possible. I look forward to sharing further updates at the next CSO meeting.



Who Can Join the CSOHNS


