

HEAD AND NECK SURGICAL ONCOLOGIST FOOTHILLS MEDICAL CENTRE

The Section of Otolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery, Department of Surgery, Alberta Health Services–Calgary Zone and the University of Calgary Cumming School of Medicine invite applications for the position of ***Academic Head and Neck Surgical Oncologist with a clinical/translational research interest***. Qualifications include an MD and a Fellowship from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in Otolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery. The successful candidate should have specific Head and Neck Oncology fellowship training (minimum 1 year), including microvascular reconstruction and transoral approaches to the management of head and neck cancer. Applicants must be eligible for licensure in the province of Alberta. The position will commence in January 2023.

The successful candidate will provide the full spectrum of subspecialty clinical services in collaboration with the existing head and neck surgeons and members of the Section of Otolaryngology – Head & Neck Surgery. This team serves a referral region with a population of over two million people. The full range of head and neck surgery is available. Clinical activities will be carried out at the Foothills Medical Centre, Richmond Road Diagnostic and Treatment Centre (ambulatory clinics), the Tom Baker Cancer Centre, and the soon to be opened, state of the art, Calgary Cancer Centre.

The recruited surgeon will support the mission of the University of Calgary and an appointment to the Cumming School of Medicine will be expected. Academic rank will be commensurate with experience and academic credentials. The successful applicant will be expected to take a leadership role in promoting and further developing the head and neck program in areas of surgical innovation, research, and education. A cohesive and successful head and neck cancer research program already exists and will provide an excellent foundation for the successful applicant in their research endeavours. Further, the Head and Neck Program is recognized for its excellence in teaching and surgical innovation. The successful applicant must be site based and will use the existing electronic medical record.

It is expected that the successful applicant will divide their time as follows:

- Perform head and neck procedures / surgeries including surgeries of the oral cavity, pharynx, larynx, paranasal sinuses, skull base, thyroid, parathyroid and salivary glands
- Conduct oncological head and neck surgical consultations at the regional cancer centre and participate in multi-disciplinary clinics and rounds.

- Devote approximately 70% of their time to head and neck clinical activity.
- Devote approximately 20% of their time to clinical research in head and neck oncology.
- Devote approximately 10% of their time to education in Otolaryngology – Head and Neck Surgery
- Participate in the otolaryngology regional call schedule.

In accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, priority will be given to Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada. Alberta Health Services and the University of Calgary are committed to employment equity.
