The University of British Columbia and the Division of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery, Providence Health Care (PHC) in Vancouver invite applications for a full-time Academic Otolologist/Neurotologist.

The individual we seek will provide tertiary and quaternary level Otolology/Neurotology care to patients from all regions of British Columbia and the Yukon; demonstrated comfort with managing complex clinical and surgical Neurotologic presentations is therefore an asset. Experience and comfort with endoscopic ear surgery, cochlear implantation and lateral skull base is preferred. Sub-specialty Fellowship training in Otolology & Neurotology is mandatory.

The PHC Otolaryngology - Head and Neck Surgery service, together with the Division of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery, University of British Columbia is involved in undergraduate and post-graduate programs and the applicant is expected to play an integral role in both didactic and clinical/surgical teaching, and further the research mandate of the division.

On-call services will cover Providence Health Care facilities (Mount St. Joseph's and St. Paul's Hospitals) as well as being available for tertiary referral services for the province with a frequency of approximately one week in eight. Payment is a fee-for-service model through the Medical Services Plan of B.C. An alternate payment plan for Otolology/Neurotology is under negotiation and may replace the fee-for-service model in the near future; the successful candidate would be expected to agree to obligations of such a model should it be implemented.

The successful candidate will be expected to:

- Show evidence of exceptional interpersonal and collaborative skills in interactions with medical and nursing, and in particular, Audiology colleagues;
- Further advance the clinical and academic productivity, and strategic goals of the Division of Otolaryngology - Head and Neck Surgery at PHC;
- Further the mandate of the Division for exceptional educational experiences for trainees, including UBC medical students, OHNS residents and other trainees.
- Have a commitment and demonstrated interest in an area of research that would augment the Division such as basic science and/or regenerative medicine, translational medicine, artificial intelligence, education, public health, or quality improvement.

Applicants must have certification in Otolaryngology - Head and Neck Surgery from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (or equivalent) and be licensed or eligible for license in the Province of British Columbia. The successful applicant shall be appointed to the Department of Surgery at the University of British Columbia as a Clinical Faculty member at a level commensurate with their experience. Equity and diversity are essential to academic excellence. An open and diverse community fosters the inclusion of voices that have been

underrepresented. We encourage applications from members of groups that have been marginalized on any grounds enumerated under the B.C. Human Rights Code, including sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, racialization, disability, political belief, religion, marital or family status, age, and/or status as a First Nation, Metis, Inuit, or Indigenous person. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents of Canada will be given priority.

Applications must include current curriculum vitae, a letter of intent including a description of previous academic experience and a description of training relevant to the position, and three reference letters. This application will remain open until the position is filled.
